What is the role of a member?

As a member you will be providing your support and helping us shape the future of The Cellardyke Trust.

You will have the opportunity to attend member meetings, share ideas and participate in decisions that will affect how The Cellardyke Trust operates and develops.

Membership also provides an opportunity to elect trustees, scrutinise accounts and vote on particular matters. Members have a key role in agreeing any amendments to the constitution.

Your membership fees will go towards running the Trust and its events.

When will meetings be held?

The first AGM of members will be held no later than May 2021 and thereafter on an annual basis. At least 14 days' notice of a meeting will be given.

Data Protection

OSCR requires a register of members to be maintained, kept up to date and the SCIO must keep the information for six years after the date on which you ceased to be a member.

If a reasonable request to the Cellardyke Trust is made to provide a list of Trustees or Members we are required by OSCR to comply, however we do not have to provide addresses or email contact details.
